From the desk of the Executive Director

Ongoing demographic challenges have produced a consistent decline in the number of Vermonters in our workforce. As a result, Governor Phil Scott, his administration, and the regional development corporations have made workforce development a priority.

A robust, skilled workforce that is large enough to supply the increasing needs of Vermont employers is critical to the state's ability to meet its obligations and provide a desirable quality of life for all Vermonters.

This Fall, the Regional Development Corporations (RDCs) of Vermont, in partnership with Vermont Department of Labor and the Statewide Workforce Development Board, are hosting 12 regional workforce summits. Building upon recent collaborations among the RDCs, employers, educators, state agencies and service providers, the summits will provide actionable solutions for employers and stimulate better coordination and partnership among these stakeholders.

The summits will follow the same agenda in each region to meet consistent objectives while encouraging discussion and solutions that meet regional needs. Summit outcomes will be used by each region and the state to strengthen local and statewide workforce development systems, to inform a 2020 statewide workforce summit hosted by VDOL and by the SWDB as it prepares its 2020 Workforce Strategy.

The Addison County Workforce Summit, hosted by ACEDC and the Addison County Workforce Alliance (ACWA) will take place on November 13, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

at the Kirk Alumni Center at Middlebury College. Governor Phil Scott is expected to attend the Summit during lunch.

The Summit will include employers - the beneficiaries of a good workforce system - and the wide range of service providers, trainers, and educators who locate, motivate, and prepare workers to be successful. The morning program is designed for employers. The afternoon program is set aside for workforce development service providers and educators. Both groups will overlap during lunch, providing the opportunity to connect and network.

Bringing Financial Resources to Addison County

ACEDC recently made loans totaling \$75,000 from our Revolving Loan Fund to two businesses: One an expansion and utilization of an under-utilized facility and the other to a start-up service company. Click <u>here</u> for more on ACEDC's RLF.

ACEDC secured \$60,000 in grants for four business expansions from the Vermont

Department of Buildings and General Services' <u>Building Communities</u> program. Click here for more details

ACEDC also secured a \$1,600 grant from VSAC/Advance Vermont to help the Addison County Workforce Alliance (<u>ACWA</u>) present a series of Financial Reality Fairs in March 2020, targeted to high school juniors and other young adults in the community.

ACEDC is leading a coalition of community organizations to file an application to the <u>Working Communities Challenge</u> offered by the Boston Federal Reserve Bank. Six winners will get \$15,000 planning grants and those six vie for three \$300,000 implementation grants. A letter of Intent was filed on November 1 and the planning grant application is due December 13.
